Events

Tuesday 9th November 2021 at 7.30pm. "Delightful Dahlias" by John Baker & June Colley.

As dark winter nights really do close in and with fingers very firmly crossed, we look forward to welcoming members back to the Peppard Memorial Hall to what John Baker & June Colley promise will be a plant lover's guide to dahlias illustrated with 100s of pictures!

Hampshire based John & June, who also maintain a collection of over 1700 hostas,

will describe how the vibrant colours & shapes of dahlias have been developed; advise on choosing dahlias to grow in containers as well as in flower beds or for cutting, and on overwintering and propagation. Something cheerful for everyone!

<u>Talk Report: Tuesday 12th October</u> 2021 "Composting" by Robert Longstaff.

Although Robert previously visited us only in November 2019, when he gave an inspirational overview of the sustainability focussed Oxford Garden Project, such was the enthusiasm of those attending that we decided to begin our '21/'22 season with a return visit for a "deep dive" into composting!

Though unfortunately for non-pandemic related reasons Robert had to give this talk via Zoom, once again as a result of his knowledge, expertise and delivery those attending were treated to a true "master class". Key messages included: really concentrating on getting the carbon/nitrogen ratio right (30:1) by making sure the "green" to "brown" balance is as close as possible to 2:1; the commonest composting problem is being "over dry" though too many grass clippings really can make everything over wet & slimy! So make sure there is good aeration e.g. by adding scrunched up cardboard. Many commercial additives are really just dried urine which can be effectively replaced with "second hand" beer or cider!

On the animals front: "mini beasts" are essential to a good compost bin/pile; though ants & ant nests suggest over-dryness, whilst fruit flies can indicate over-wetness! With respect to larger beasts: care should be taken in early spring as hedgehogs & grass snakes love the warmth of a good compost pile, whilst "vermin" problems can be minimised by scrupulously avoiding putting animal/meat waste on a compost bin and/or giving your bin a good kicking every day to deter unwanted nesters!

RHS Jobs to do in the garden -November

Winter is on its way

Leaves are falling rapidly, and wind and rain are on the increase. Tender plants will need protecting from frost, gales and freezing rains. Move plants into the greenhouse, or into a sheltered spot, but if you can't, it is worth wrapping plants or pots. Remember winter can be a tough time for birds in terms of water and food, so keep supplies well topped up.

- 1 Clear up fallen leaves especially from lawns, ponds and beds
- 2 Raise containers onto pot feet to prevent waterlogging
- 3 Plant tulip bulbs for a spring display next year
- 4 Prune roses to prevent wind-rock
- 5 Plant out winter bedding
- 6 Cover brassicas with netting if pigeons are a problem
- 7 Insulate outdoor containers from frost bubble wrap works well
- 8 Stop winter moth damage to fruit trees using grease bands around the trunks
- 9 Put out bird food to encourage winter birds into the garden

10 Use a seasonal bonfire - where this is allowed - to dispose of excess debris unfit for composting
