August 7th Visit to Farley Hill Gardens

As we did not have a visit in June we thought it would be nice to organise an August visit where members could meet up and socialise. To minimise Covid risk members will travel in their own vehicles.

Farley Hill Place Gardens dates back to the reign of George II, being built from 1729 as a productive garden for a Georgian manor house. It was owned by Mr John Walter, uncle of the founder of the Times Newspaper in 1730.

With its $1\frac{1}{2}$ acre walled garden, grand Victorian glasshouse, fine old apple trees and hazel coppice, Farley Hill Place Gardens take you back in time to when they produced fruit, vegetables and flowers for the 'big house'.

We have booked a visit to the gardens on Saturday 7th August at 2 pm. They start the visit with a short introduction about the garden and its history then Members can wonder freely and return for tea and cake. Finishing with a Q&A. The cost is £10.00 inclusive.

There is plenty of parking at the gardens, front and back of the house.

RHS Gardening Jobs June as Summer arrives

A busy month ahead

Top tips

Now is the time to get your veg off the best possible start. So make sure anything you plant out is fed, watered and given an appropriate support (such as bamboo canes for runner beans).

June 21 is the longest day of the year, and the extra light and warmth encourages the garden to put on an exuberant burst of growth. But this extra light and warmth also means weeds will sprout up from seemingly nowhere. Keep on top of them by hoeing regularly in dry conditions.

Top 10 jobs this month

- 1 Hoe borders regularly to keep down weeds
- 2 Be water-wise, especially in droughtaffected areas
- 3 Pinch out sideshoots on tomatoes
- 4 Harvest lettuce, radish, other salads and early potatoes
- 5 Position summer hanging baskets and containers outside
- 6 Mow lawns at least once a week
- 7 Plant out summer bedding
- 8 Stake tall or floppy plants
- 9 Prune many spring-flowering shrubs
- 10 Shade greenhouses to keep them cool and prevent scorch

Trip Saturday 18th September

Cotswold Wildlife Park is well known for its gardens as well as the 1500 animals and birds within the 160 acres.

The gardens are well maintained and creative and compliment all the enclosures and pathways. There is an arboretum near the old Manor House and herbaceous beds within the walled garden.

The park has a narrow gauge railway line which is extra and has two cafes, a shop and during the day there are timed feeding displays for the penguins and lemurs. The Park's animals include lion, camel, giraffe, ostrich, llama, zebra, rhino, wolf as well as many reptiles, birds and collection of primates. All are within reach by foot or railway.

Departure is 9 am from bus stop on junction of Wood Lane and Kennylands Rd on left side towards the shops. Next stop is outside the Village Hall 9.05 and last stop is 9.15 on Stoke Row Rd at bus stop near the Peppard stores.

Journey will take just over an hour or so.
There are 35 places. Option to bring picnic or use the cafes.
