The happy band of gardening enthusiasts boarded the coach in Sonning Common and Peppard and headed off to Northamptonshire.

We had been advised in advance that the Tea Rooms at Castle Ashby would not be open (due to staff shortages we understand), so homemade picnic and sandwiches were the order of the day. Following the previous two days of unbroken sunshine and soaring temperatures, hopes were high that the weekend weather forecast was not totally reliable! However, the closer we got to Castle Ashby, the more the mizzle turned to serious rain and the cloud cover turned a tad greyer.


Not to be daunted the cheery folk unpacked the packer-macs, donned the waterproof jackets and dug the umbrellas out of bags and back packs.

The gardens were a delight. There were beautifully manicured lawns as far as the eye could see; fabulous displays of colour in all the herbaceous borders and flower



beds.

There were also a number of different areas to explore including the fuchsia house, rainbow border, Italian garden, Orangery, vegetable garden, the menagerie (with a charming troupe of meerkats, flop eared rabbits, a pair of giant tortoises, rare breed piglets, a batch of splendid fluffy chicks and others); this led you on to the walled garden.



One could follow the Nature Trail through the Arboretum toward the lake and the terracotta bridge designed by Capability Brown. The trees were truly magnificent, including the UK's largest Weeping Beech which was huge! An amazing variety and it was so very peaceful there.



It was decided by the group, as the precipitation had increased, we should give up "Just Walking in the Rain" (Johnnie Ray 1956) and it was considered a good idea to head off in the coach to the nearby collection of small shops that included a cafe. ### RHS Jobs in July

Summer is progressing

This is often one of the hottest months of the year and a great time to sit out and enjoy your garden. Keep plants looking good by regularly dead-heading, and you'll enjoy a longer display of blooms. Make sure you keep new plants well watered, using grey water where possible, and hoe off weeds, which thrive in the sunshine.

Top gardening jobs this month
1 Deadhead bedding plants and repeatflowering perennials, to ensure continuous
flowering

Keep plants looking attractive and encourage more blooms, whether in beds and border, containers or hanging baskets. Encourage more blooms

2 Care for houseplant while on holiday Most houseplants will tolerate a few days' absence without suffering, but absences of more than a week call for some creative measures to provide valuable moisture in the right quantity.

Look after plants while away

3 Water tubs and new plants if dry, but be water-wise

Watering is one of the most important jobs when growing plants in containers. Roots need a balance of air and water to

grow well which is easy to provide if you have a good quality compost or soil.

4 Check clematis for signs of clematis wilt 5 Pick courgettes before they become marrows

6 Treat apple scab

7 Clear algae, blanket weeds and debris from ponds, and keep them topped up 8 Order catalogues for next year's springflowering bulbs

9 Give the lawn a quick-acting summer feed, especially if not given a spring feed 10 Harvest apricots, peaches and nectarines
