### <u>TALKS</u>

#### Tuesday 14<sup>th</sup> March at 19.30 "For the Love of Roses" by Gillian Taylor

Hampshire based Gillian will explain how she became a rose fan, progressing from having only 2 rose bushes a few years ago to now having over 200 varieties in her collection. She will discuss the diverse types of rose available, where to buy them, how to use them in various garden settings, their care & propagation and suggestions for plants to accompany them in your borders.

Please note that Gillian supports the horticultural charity Perennial through her talks.

#### Tuesday 11<sup>th</sup> April at 19.30 "Heavenley Hostas" by June Colley & John Baker

A return visit by both members of this husband and wife Hampshire based plant loving and expert partnership - John gave us a beautifully illustrated talk on "Delightful Dahlias" in November 2021.

Both June and John are also both passionate about Hostas and hold the National Collection of European and Asiatic Hostas – comprising some 1500 cultivars! They are also senior officers of the British Hosta and Hemerocallis Society whose patron is none other that King Charles, another Hosta devotee and himself holder of the Large & Giant leaved part of the National Hosta Collection! Come and see why these diverse plants excite such exalted interest and perhaps how deter the interest of slugs and snails!

#### <u>Talk Report:</u> Tuesday 14<sup>th</sup> February. "Gertrude Jekyll" by Richard Bisgrove

Our now annual afternoon meeting brought a large audience out to learn about this incredibly influential late Victorian/early 20<sup>th</sup> century garden designer and plantswoman from Richard Bisgrove who is both honorary life-member of CEHS and acknowledged international expert on Jekyll.

A fascinating and unusual Victorian spinster, Gertrude Jekyll was a skilled artist and embroiderer, being strongly influenced by JMW Turner, yet had very poor eyesight throughout her life! She also had a very unusual and close, though almost certainly purely professional and platonic, relationship with the architect Edwin Lutyens.

A real workaholic Jekyll continued to design gardens well into the twentieth century. These frequently include her trademark swathes of Turner-like colour. She also wrote almost a book a year and was a frequent contributor to "The Garden" - the most influential and academic horticultural journal of it's time. All with dreadful eyesight!

#### <u>Spring arrives</u>

Spring usually arrives by mid-March and the frequent sunny days provide the opportunity for an increasing range of gardening tasks. It's time to get busy preparing seed beds, sowing seed, cutting back winter shrubs and generally tidying up around the garden. 1. Prune bush and climbing roses

These general tips for rose pruning will help you improve the health and lifespan of any rose.

2. Plant shallots, onion sets and early potatoes

3. Plant summer-flowering bulbs

Bulbs make a fine display planted in containers or borders, especially daffodils, snowdrops and tulips in spring. They are one of the easiest and most rewarding garden plants to grow.

4. Lift and divide overgrown clumps of perennials

5. Top dress containers with fresh compost

6. Mow the lawn on dry days (if needed)

7. Cut back Cornus (dogwood) and Salix (willow) grown for colourful winter stems

8. Hoe and mulch weeds to keep them under control early

9. Start feeding fish and using the pond fountain; remove pond heaters

10. Protect new spring shoots from slugs
